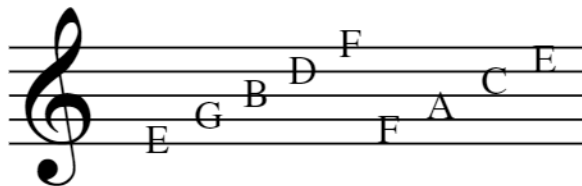


LETTER NAMES AND SPACES

Every line and space of the staff has a letter name. In the staff below, notice that we use letters **A, B, C, D, E, F** and **G**. Then we start all over again. (The letters **H, I** or **J** are not used in music.)



Starting from the bottom, the lines are **E, G, B, D** and **F**.

Here is a sentence to help you remember the names of the lines. Every word in the sentence begins with one of the letter names of the lines.

Every Good Boy Does Fine.

Here is a sentence to help you remember the names of the spaces.

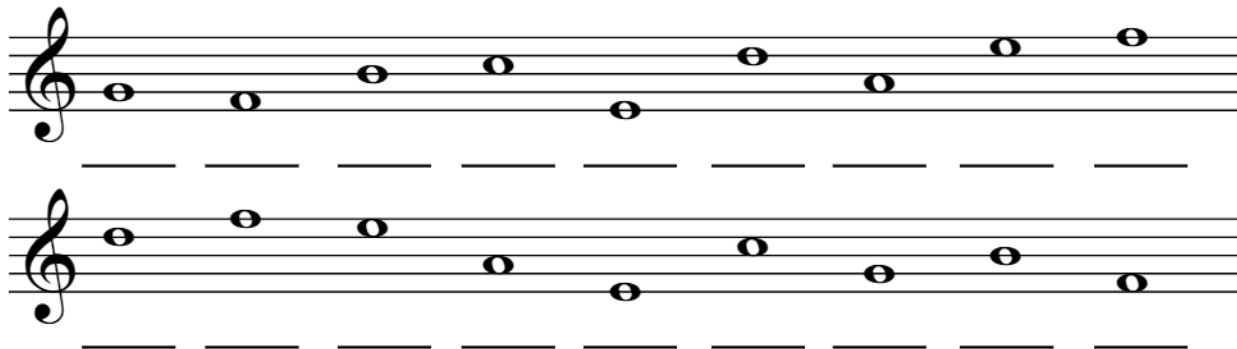
Father Always Cries Easily.
