

Many of our music activities will require the use of FlipGrid to record and submit student performances. This first page provides instructions for accessing and using FlipGrid.

ACCESSING FLIPGRID FOR MUSIC ACTIVITIES

NOTE – Students will need to login to FlipGrid with their full Cobb County user name and password (see example below) or an email address from one of the following domains:

@cobbk12.org @outlook.com
@gmail.com @yahoo.com

STUDENT LOGIN EXAMPLE: firstname.lastname@students.cobbk12.org

PASSWORD: same password used for school computers (often a lunch number)

- **OPTION 1** - Log into CLEVER (www.clever.com) and use your student login and password. Look for “Mr. G’s Music Class Page” to find direct links to flipgrid and other music content.

REMEMBER

- Tell us the title and author of your poem.

- A composition is something that has a plan and can be repeated (Improvisation is making it up on the spot). So consider writing down what you want to do in your performance. For example, you might write down the names of notes you want to play on the recorder/piano/digital app.
- Practice your performance until you are comfortable with it and ready to perform!
